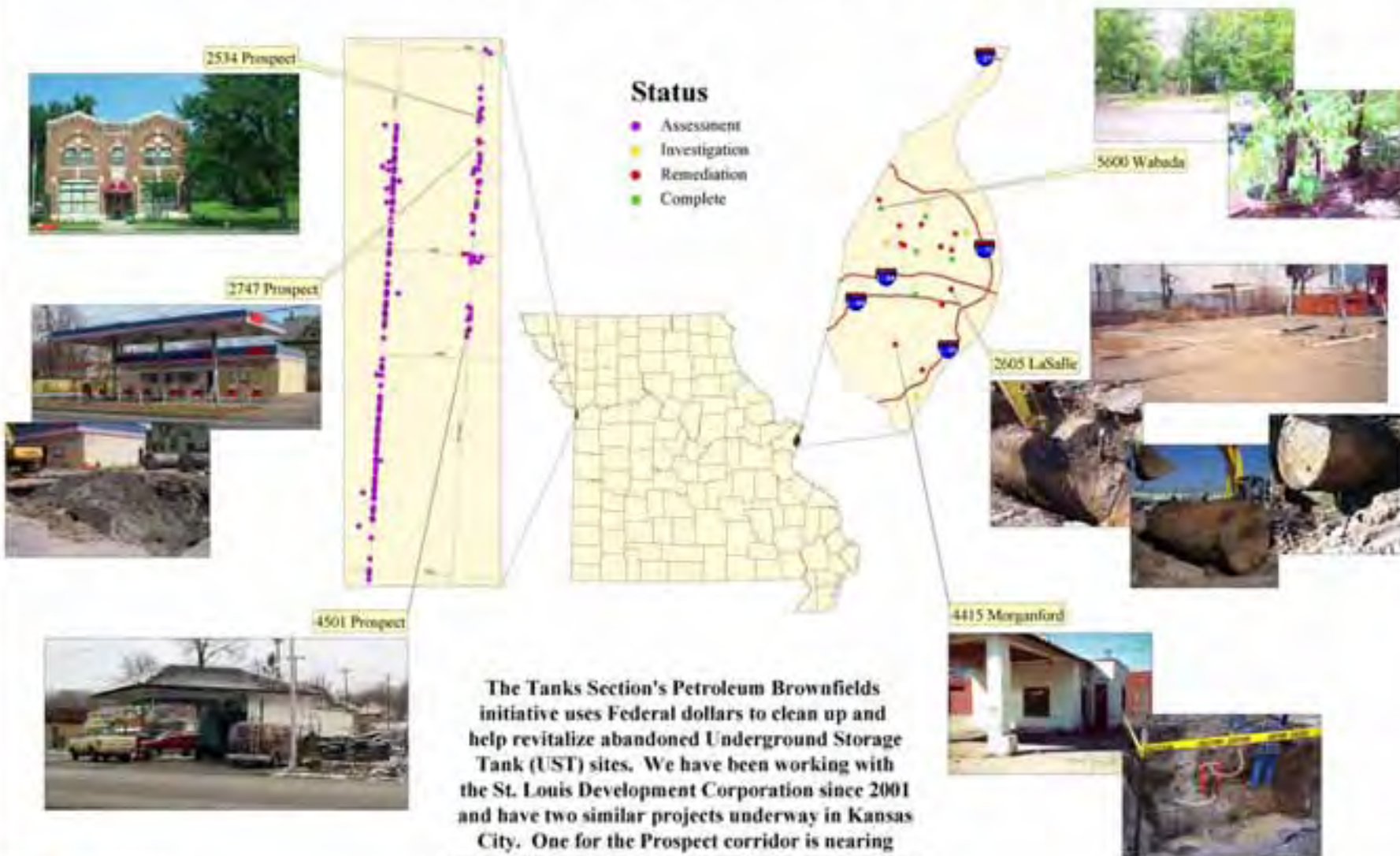

# Petroleum Brownfield Initiatives in Missouri



The Tanks Section's Petroleum Brownfields initiative uses Federal dollars to clean up and help revitalize abandoned Underground Storage Tank (UST) sites. We have been working with the St. Louis Development Corporation since 2001 and have two similar projects underway in Kansas City. One for the Prospect corridor is nearing completion and the other along the Troost corridor is in its beginning stage of Phase I assessments.
